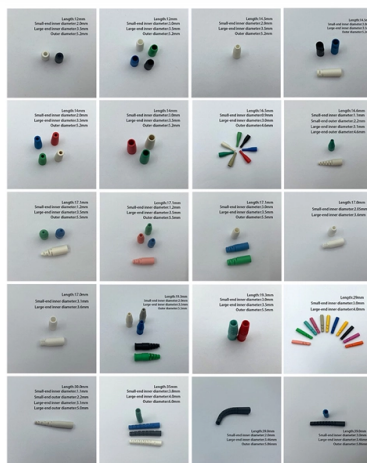


Add a lighting box to the distribution box
