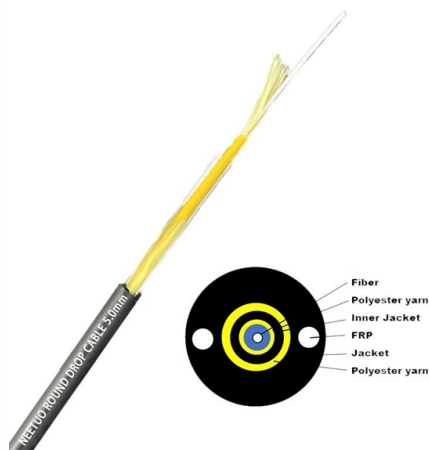


Cable Head Connection Method for Cable Trays

Selecting the Right Cable Heads

Ensure the heads are rated for the voltage, current, and environmental conditions of your installation. For armored or multi-core cables, use compatible glands or lugs to secure the cable ends.

Installation Steps

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Measure and Cut Cables: Determine the required cable length to reach the termination point. Cut the cable using a suitable cutter and deburr the ends to prevent insulation damage .

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Strip Insulation: Carefully strip the outer insulation to expose the conductors without nicking them. For armored cables, remove the armor and inner sheath according to the cable head manufacturer's instructions.

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Attach Cable Heads:

- Insert the stripped conductors into the cable head terminals or lugs.
- Tighten screws or clamps to secure the conductors firmly.
- For shielded or armored cables, ensure the grounding or bonding connection is properly attached to the tray or grounding strap .

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Position in the Tray: Place the cable with the attached head into the tray, ensuring it is supported and does not hang freely. Use cable ties, clamps, or hold-down clips to prevent movement and sagging .

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Maintain Separation and Segregation: Keep power, control, and data cables separated according to code requirements to prevent interference. Group and bundle cables neatly, avoiding sharp bends or excessive tension .

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Final Inspection: Verify that all cable heads are secure, connections are tight, and cables are properly supported. Check for compliance with NEC Article 392 or local regulations regarding fill ratios, spacing, and grounding .

Tips for Long-Term Reliability

- Avoid over-tightening connectors, which can damage conductors.
- Use protective grommets or bushings at tray entry points to prevent abrasion.
- Label cables and terminations for easy identification and maintenance.
- Periodically inspect cable heads and tray supports for wear, corrosion, or loosening . By following these steps, you can safely and efficiently add cable heads to cable trays, ensuring a reliable and code-compliant installation.
