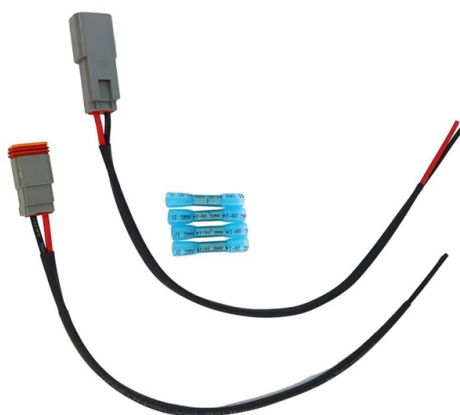

 - Best Use: Light to medium cable loads, often for data and communication cables.
 - Advantages: Lightweight, flexible routing, and good ventilation . 5. Single Rail Cable Tray
 - Structure: A single rail or track with attachments for cable support.
 - Best Use: Specific installations where space is limited or for supporting individual cable runs.
 - Advantages: Compact design and easy installation . 6. Channel Cable Tray
 - Structure: U-shaped or C-shaped channel.
 - Best Use: Smaller cable bundles or control cables.
 - Advantages: Provides moderate protection and support while being easy to mount .

- Stainless Steel (304, 316): Corrosion-resistant, durable, suitable for harsh environments .
 - Electrogalvanized Steel: Strong, adaptable, and corrosion-resistant .
 - Hot Dip Galvanized Steel: Extra protection against chemicals, moisture, and high temperatures .
 - PVC: Resistant to impact, weather, and fire; lightweight and easy to install .

For underground or vault installations, steel racks with T-slots and hooks are used to support cables securely and prevent damage, often hot-dip galvanized for durability .
