Where trays cannot be separated, run one system (typically data) in metallic conduit for additional shielding. Schedule downtime or phased migration to minimize disruption. Label and document all cable moves. Maintaining proper separation between power, data, and limited energy cabling is foundational to system performance, safety, and code compliance. Separation isn't just an EMI precaution — it protects signaling, reduces rework, and ensures pathways meet inspection expectations across risers. cable trays are equivalent.
