

Can a PoE switch connect to a non-PoE switch



Overview

Yes, a PoE switch can pass through a non-PoE switch. It allows compatible devices, such as VoIP phones, network surveillance cameras or wireless access points to work in places where power outlets or network connections don't exist. But many people still. Non-PoE (Power over Ethernet) devices are network equipment that rely solely on traditional power sources, such as wall outlets or power adapters, to operate.
