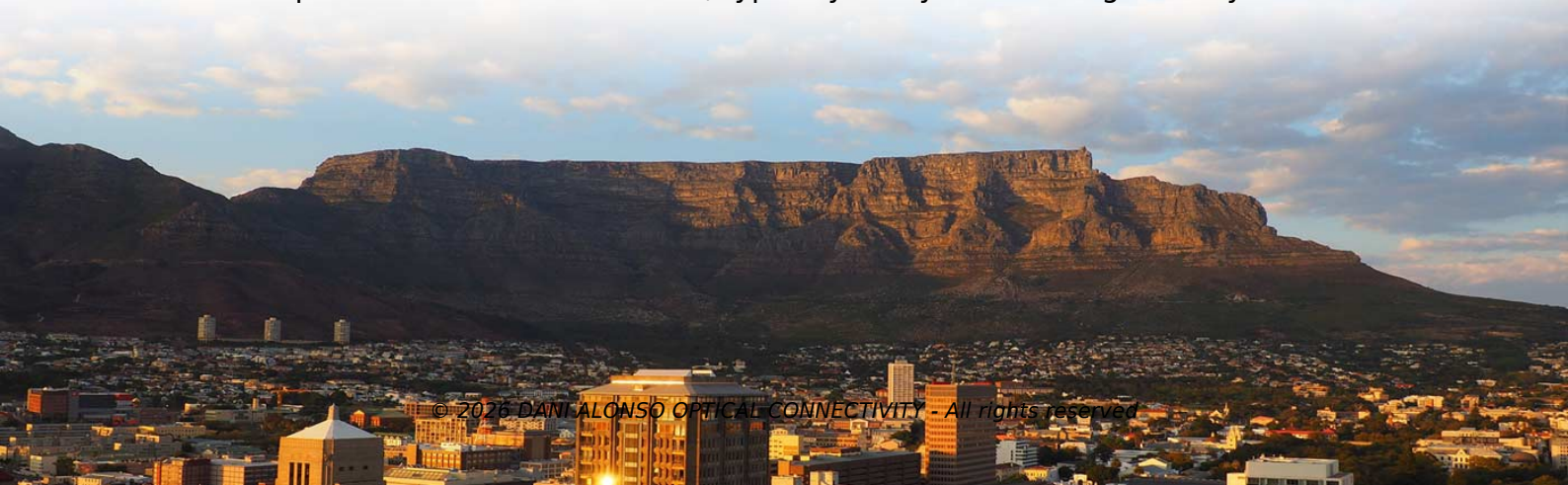

Cable trays often come with pre-punched holes for mounting, cable entry/exit, or accessory attachment, but additional holes may be needed for specific installations . Drilling new holes is possible, but several factors must be considered:

- **Structural Integrity:** Drilling can weaken the tray, especially in ladder or solid-bottom trays. Avoid drilling near rungs or side rails that bear the load .
- **Cable Protection:** Any drilled hole should be fitted with bushings or grommets to prevent abrasion and damage to cable jackets, particularly in areas subject to vibration .
- **Moisture Management:** For solid-bottom trays, small weep holes are sometimes drilled to prevent water accumulation, typically every 3 feet along the tray .



- **Fire Safety:** If the tray passes through a fire-rated barrier, holes must be carefully managed. Large or irregular holes can compromise firestopping, and retrofitting with sleeves or fire-rated seals may be required . Using a sleeve system allows the tray to stop short of the barrier, with the sleeve providing a fire-rated penetration.

- **Plan Hole Locations:** Avoid critical load-bearing areas and maintain proper spacing.
- **Use Proper Tools:** Diamond or metal drills provide clean, precise holes without rough edges .
- **Install Protective Bushings:** Prevent cable damage and maintain compliance with electrical codes .
- **Maintain Fire Ratings:** For penetrations through walls or floors, use tested firestop systems or sleeves to restore fire barrier integrity .
- **Check Manufacturer Guidelines:** Some cable tray systems have pre-punched holes or recommend specific drilling practices; follow these to avoid voiding warranties or reducing load capacity .

Drilling holes through cable trays is feasible and sometimes necessary for cable routing, grounding, or moisture control. However, it must be done strategically, using protective bushings, maintaining structural strength, and ensuring compliance with fire and electrical safety standards.
