

Configure ports for multiple fiber optic switches



Overview

Choose an SFP module based on the fiber optic cabling that will be connected to the network switches.

Configuring fiber optic ports on a switch involves selecting the correct SFP module, connecting the fiber cable, and setting the port mode, speed, and VLAN on the switch.

Step 1: Identify the Fiber Port and Module

Most modern switches use SFP (Small Form-Factor Pluggable) or SFP+ modules for fiber connections. SFP supports up to 1 Gbps, while SFP+ supports 10 Gbps. Determine whether your switch port is SFP, SFP+, or a combo port (shared with RJ45 copper) and select the appropriate module for your fiber type:

- Multimode fiber (MMF): Short-distance connections, typically 850nm wavelength.
- Single-mode fiber (SMF): Long-distance connections, typically 1310nm or 1550nm wavelength .

Step 2: Connect the Fiber Cable

Use a fiber patch cord compatible with your module type. Ensure the connectors match the SFP module (usually LC connectors). Insert the module into the switch port and connect the fiber cable to the corresponding device or switch .

Step 3: Configure the Switch Port

Access the switch via console, SSH, or web interface. For Cisco switches, the steps include:

- Log in to the switch and configure basic settings (hostname, IP, passwords).
- Enter interface configuration mode for the fiber port:

```
interface GigabitEthernet1/0/1
```

- Set the port to fiber mode if required (some combo ports default to copper).
- Configure speed and duplex if not auto-negotiated:

```
speed 1000duplex full
```

- Assign the port to a VLAN if needed:

```
switchport mode accessswitchport access vlan 10
```

- Save the configuration:

```
copy running-config startup-config" [^4^] [^5^].
```

For Fibre Channel switches, you may also need to configure the port mode (E, F, TE, SD) and VSAN assignments for SAN connectivity .

Step 4: Verify Connectivity

Check the port status and link lights. Use commands like show interface status or show interface transceiver to confirm the module is recognized and the link is active.

Step 5: Additional Considerations

- Ensure fiber polarity is correct (TX/RX alignment).
- Use cleaning tools to prevent signal loss from dirty connectors.
- For long-distance or high-speed links, verify MTU size and buffer settings if applicable .
- On Ubiquiti UniFi switches, the SFP port speed and medium are determined by the module, not the port itself . By following these steps, you can successfully configure fiber optic ports on most managed switches, ensuring reliable high-speed connectivity between devices or switches.
