For residential installations, the distribution box should be mounted at approximately 1.5 meters above the floor, which is convenient for operation and out of reach of children. In industrial or commercial settings, the height can vary depending on surrounding equipment and space, but a general guideline is 1.2–1.6 meters to the center of operation to allow easy access without ladders.

Horizontal and Equipment Spacing

- The horizontal distance between the distribution box and fixed electrical equipment should not exceed 3 meters to ensure proper connectivity and safety.



- For construction sites or multi-level distribution systems, the distance between primary, secondary, and tertiary distribution boxes should comply with local electrical codes, and all boxes should be equipped with appropriate leakage protection .

Clearance and Ventilation

- Leave enough space around the box for air circulation to prevent overheating and for future maintenance .

- Ensure hinged doors can open fully without obstruction and that breakers, fuses, and disconnects are reachable from standing height .

Safety and Environmental Considerations

- Keep the box away from water, flammable, explosive, or corrosive substances .
- For outdoor installations, select enclosures with IP66 or higher to protect against dust, water jets, and UV exposure .
- Ground all metal parts and ensure proper wiring of neutral and protective conductors to prevent electric shock or equipment damage .

Maintenance and Future-Proofing

- Maintain organized wiring using cable ties or channels to reduce short-circuit risks and simplify future maintenance .
- Leave sufficient space inside the box for future expansion or upgrades .
- Perform regular inspections, especially in harsh or outdoor environments, including torque checks, visual inspections, and thermal scans . By following these guidelines, a distribution box can be installed safely, remain accessible for routine operations, and comply with electrical standards while minimizing risks of overheating, short circuits, or accidental contact.
