The distribution box, also known as a consumer unit or DB box, should be easily reachable without ladders or awkward stretching, allowing homeowners to reset RCDs quickly and electricians to perform inspections or maintenance safely . Recommended mounting height for the main switch in new builds is between 1350mm and 1450mm above finished floor level, while switches and outlets should generally be 450mm to 1200mm above the floor to comply with Approved Document M . Ensure at least 3 feet of clearance in front of the panel and that the door can open at least 90 degrees .

Environmental Considerations

Avoid installing the distribution box in bathrooms, shower rooms, or areas prone to moisture, as water exposure can damage electrical equipment . If installation near water is unavoidable, the unit must have an appropriate IP (Ingress Protection) rating for the environment. Downstairs utility rooms, basements, or dedicated cupboards away from water sources are typically suitable .

Safety and Compliance

The distribution box serves as the central hub for electricity, distributing power safely to circuits and protecting against overloads, short circuits, and ground faults . Components include circuit breakers, fuses, bus bars, and sometimes smart monitoring units for energy management . Compliance with BS 7671 regulations ensures safe operation, inspection, and maintenance . Avoid placing the panel near flammable materials or in bedrooms if possible, and ensure the area is clutter-free .

Practical Tips

- Choose a dry, accessible location such as a basement, utility room, or garage .
- Maintain adequate clearance around the box for safe operation and maintenance .
- Ensure the unit is mounted securely on a wall or suitable surface, avoiding damp or unstable areas .
- Label circuits clearly for easy identification during power restoration or maintenance .
- Consider future expansion or upgrades when selecting the location . By following these guidelines, a downstairs distribution box will be safe, compliant, and convenient for everyday use and emergency situations.
