East Asia has experienced remarkable economic growth over the past two decades, with countries like China and the ASEAN "Big 5" (Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, the Philippines, and Vietnam) achieving high annual growth rates and lifting billions out of poverty (World Bank, 2020). This growth has been driven largely by trade liberalization and investment openness. Key milestones include the establishment of the ASEAN Free Trade Area in 1992, multiple ASEAN+1 free trade agreements, and China's accession to the WTO in 2001. The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP), signed in 2020, now forms the largest trading bloc globally, covering 2.2 billion people and \$26.2 trillion in output, with tariffs set to be gradually eliminated over 20 years.

Sustainable Development and SWITCH-Asia



The SWITCH-Asia Programme, launched by the European Union in 2007, complements economic integration by promoting sustainable consumption and production (SCP) across Asia . It supports micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs) in adopting cleaner technologies, circular economy practices, and low-carbon industrial processes. The programme funds pilot projects across sectors such as energy efficiency, agri-food, textiles, and tourism, indirectly benefiting tens of thousands of MSMEs and fostering environmentally responsible consumer behavior . By integrating sustainability into industrial and trade practices, SWITCH-Asia strengthens the resilience of communities and aligns regional growth with global environmental goals .

Convergence Mechanism

The “convergence switch” in East Asia can be understood as the synergy between trade liberalization and sustainable development initiatives. Economic integration through RCEP facilitates market access, investment flows, and harmonized standards, while programs like SWITCH-Asia ensure that growth is environmentally sustainable and socially inclusive. Together, these mechanisms encourage the adoption of circular economy models, cleaner production technologies, and responsible consumption patterns, creating a low-carbon, resource-efficient regional economy .
