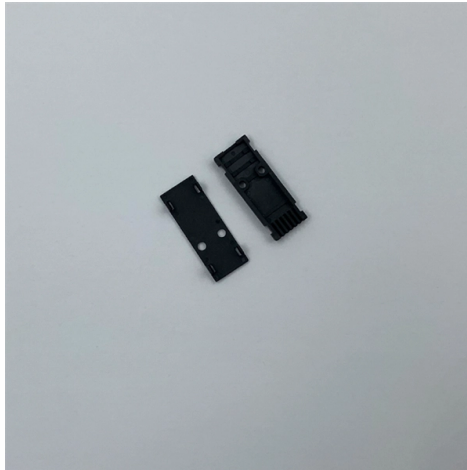


How many degrees can the pigtail bend

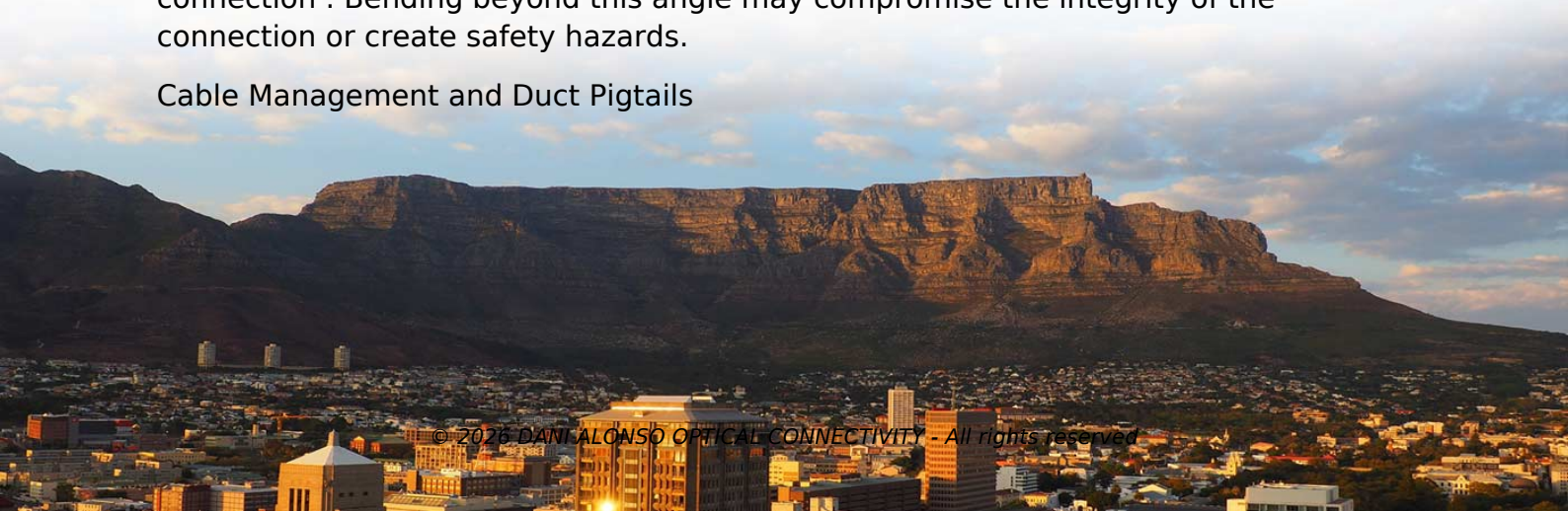

For SMA coaxial pigtails used in RF applications, the cable should be bent gently to avoid signal degradation. A smooth arc is recommended, and sharp folds or tight loops can cause insertion loss or intermittent failures, especially at higher frequencies like 2.4 GHz or 5 GHz. While a precise maximum angle isn't always specified, maintaining a gentle bend and avoiding kinks is critical for performance inside enclosures .

Propane Regulator Pigtails

In gas applications, pigtails are often pre-bent during fabrication to fit under tanks or in tight spaces. Standard bends for these pigtails are typically 90 degrees, allowing the regulator to be installed close to the service valve without stressing the connection . Bending beyond this angle may compromise the integrity of the connection or create safety hazards.

Cable Management and Duct Pigtails



For cable management systems, pigtail guides can provide bends of up to 90 degrees, and multiple guides can be combined to form U-turns, circles, or spirals as needed. The bend radius should be chosen to prevent damage to the cable insulation and maintain proper routing.

Practical Guidelines

- Avoid sharp bends that exceed the cable's minimum bend radius.
- For coaxial cables, a bend radius of at least 3–5 times the cable diameter is often recommended.
- For gas or mechanical pigtails, follow manufacturer specifications, typically not exceeding 90 degrees unless designed for multiple bends.
- Always ensure bends do not stress connectors or insulation, which can lead to failure over time. In summary, most pigtails can safely bend up to 90 degrees, but the exact limit depends on the material, application, and manufacturer guidelines. Gentle arcs are preferred for coaxial cables, while pre-bent angles are standard for gas regulator connections.
