- Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Converts the fiber's optical signals into electrical signals your router can use, usually provided by your ISP.

Step-by-Step Connection

- Install the ONT:

- Locate the fiber wall outlet from your ISP.

- Connect the fiber optic cable from the wall outlet to the ONT's fiber port.

- Power on the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize (usually 2-5 minutes).

- Bridge the ONT to the Router:
- Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN/Internet port .
- Power on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm a successful connection.
- Verify the Connection:
- ONT lights: Power (solid green) and PON/Optical (solid green or blue) indicate a healthy fiber link .
- Router lights: WAN/Internet light should indicate connectivity.

Tips for Optimal Performance

- Place the ONT and router near power outlets and in a dry, ventilated area .
- Avoid bending or stressing the fiber cable; improper handling can degrade signal by over 30% .
- If your router lacks a fiber port, a media converter may be required to convert fiber to Ethernet .
- Access the router's web interface (usually 192.168.0.1 or 192.168.1.1) to configure settings like Quality of Service (QoS) for VoIP or video calls .

Troubleshooting

- No connection: Check fiber seating in the ONT and ensure the Ethernet cable is properly connected.
- Flashing PON light: Indicates the ONT is still registering with the ISP; wait a few minutes or contact your provider .
- Red or LOS light: Suggests a fiber line issue; contact your ISP for inspection. By following these steps, you can safely and efficiently connect a fiber optic cable to your router, ensuring high-speed, low-latency internet performance .

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Connect the Cable: Gently insert the fiber cable connector into the device's fiber port. It should click into place.
