- Disconnect Input Power
- Disconnect the main input cables from the utility or generator feed.
- For DC systems, ensure arc detection and quenching mechanisms are in place before disconnecting .
- Dismantle the Enclosure
- Remove screws, bolts, or fasteners securing the enclosure panels.
- Carefully lift panels to avoid damaging internal wiring or components.
- Remove Internal Components
- Extract internal busbars, monitoring units, or intelligent modules.
- Handle sensitive electronics with anti-static precautions.
- Inspect and Store Components
- Inspect all components for wear, damage, or corrosion.
- Store modules and breakers in a dry, static-free environment.

- IEC Standards Compliance: Ensure compliance with IEC 61439-1 for low-voltage switchgear and control gear assemblies .
