

How to install lights on cable trays

Before installing lighting, plan the tray route carefully, considering clearance, load capacity, and separation from other electrical cables to prevent interference or overheating . Choose the appropriate tray type: ladder trays are ideal for lighting circuits because they provide excellent ventilation and convenient anchor points for securing cables and fixtures . Perforated or solid-bottom trays may be used for lighter loads or aesthetic requirements, but ladder trays are preferred for heat dissipation and easy access .

Support and Mounting

Proper support is critical. Trapeze hangers are commonly used for ceiling suspension, while cantilever wall brackets are suitable for vertical or wall-mounted runs . Supports should be spaced according to manufacturer specifications, typically 1.5 to 3 meters apart, depending on tray type and load . Ensure all supports are level and secure to prevent sagging, which could compromise lighting installation .



Cable and Fixture Installation

- Cable fill: Do not exceed the maximum fill ratio (usually 50%) to avoid overheating . Calculate the cross-sectional area of lighting cables and ensure compliance with NEC 392.22.
- Securing cables: Use cable ties or straps to organize lighting circuits separately from high-voltage or power cables .
- Fixture attachment: Light fixtures can be mounted directly to the tray rungs or via brackets, ensuring they do not overload the tray or obstruct airflow .
- Bends and transitions: Mark locations for bends, tees, or risers and use appropriate fittings to maintain smooth cable routing .

Grounding and Bonding

Metal cable trays must be properly grounded and bonded to maintain electrical safety . Use bonding jumpers across tray sections to ensure continuity, which protects both the lighting system and personnel from electrical faults.

Final Checks

- Verify that all cables and fixtures are securely fastened.
- Ensure proper separation between lighting circuits and other power or data cables.
- Label lighting circuits for easy identification and future maintenance .
- Conduct a final inspection to confirm compliance with NEC and local electrical codes . By following these steps, lighting installation on cable trays can be safe, code-compliant, and maintainable, while allowing for future upgrades or modifications.
