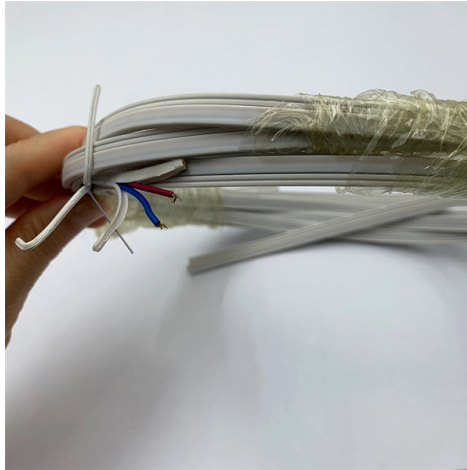


How to solve the problem of fiber optic cable in routers

Troubleshooting Steps



1. Check for Service Outages Before troubleshooting your equipment, verify whether your ISP is experiencing a local service outage. Visit their website or social media pages for updates, as outages can cause connectivity issues without any fault in your hardware . 2. Inspect the Fiber Optic Cable Look for physical damage such as cuts, kinks, or sharp bends in the fiber optic cable. Ensure the cable is properly connected to the router's WAN or ONT port. Fiber cables are delicate, and even small bends (microbends or macrobends) can cause signal loss or attenuation . 3. Check Connectors and Splices Dirty or damaged connectors can disrupt signal transmission. Use a fiber optic cleaning kit to clean both ends of the cable. If connectors are physically damaged, replace them. Poor splicing can also cause signal loss, so professional inspection may be necessary . 4. Reboot Your Router Turn off the router, unplug it from the power source, wait 30 seconds, then reconnect and power it on. This can resolve temporary glitches and restore connectivity . 5. Reset the Router (if needed) If rebooting does not work, perform a factory reset. Locate the reset button, press and hold it for 10–30 seconds, and allow the router to restart. Be aware that this will erase custom settings, so have your ISP credentials ready . 6. Verify All Connections Ensure the power cable, LAN cables, and fiber optic cable are securely connected. Loose or improperly connected cables can cause intermittent connectivity or a blinking LOS (Loss of Signal) light . 7. Test Direct Connection To determine if the router is the issue, connect a device directly to the modem or ONT using an Ethernet cable. If the internet works, the router may be faulty; if not, the problem likely lies with the fiber service . 8. Contact Your ISP If the above steps do not resolve the issue, contact your ISP. Provide details such as the LOS light status, observations about the cable, and your account information for faster troubleshooting .

Preventive Measures

- Avoid sharp bends and physical strain on fiber cables.
- Use protective conduits and proper routing to prevent crushing or pinching.
- Maintain clean connectors and inspect cables regularly.
- Ensure proper ventilation for networking equipment to prevent overheating .
