When installing fiber optic cable on a power pole, you must first determine whether the cable is self-supporting (ADSS) or requires a messenger wire. Self-supporting cables can span between poles without additional support, while non-self-supporting cables must be tied to a steel messenger or existing guy wire for support . Use cable clamps, suspension clamps, or pole brackets designed for aerial fiber installation to secure the cable without stressing the fibers .

Attaching to the Guy Wire

- **Assess the Guy Wire:** Ensure the guy wire is strong enough to bear the additional load of the fiber cable. Guy wires are typically galvanized steel and tensioned to support the pole .
- **Use Proper Clamps or Ties:** Fiber optic cables should be attached using cable suspension clamps or banding ties that grip the cable's strength members (usually aramid yarn or steel) rather than the fiber jacket to prevent damage .

- **Maintain Clearance:** Keep sufficient distance between the fiber cable and power lines, following the National Electrical Safety Code. The fiber should occupy the uppermost communication space on the pole .
 - **Avoid Excess Tension:** Do not pull the cable too tightly. Consider sag and elongation during installation to prevent overstressing the fibers. The minimum bend radius should be respected to avoid kinking .
 - **Evenly Space Supports:** Use clamps or ties at regular intervals (typically every 50 cm along the pole) to distribute the load evenly and prevent localized stress .

- **Pre-survey the route** to identify obstacles, clearance issues, and suitable poles for attachment .
 - **Use temporary supports** if needed to relieve unbalanced loads during installation .
 - **Follow manufacturer specifications** for pulling tension, bend radius, and crush resistance to avoid fiber damage .
 - **Inspect existing poles and guy wires** to ensure they can handle the additional load before installation .
