Unpacking and Installation

- Data Collection: Use the provided interface (e.g., CorView or touchscreen menus) to monitor voltages, currents, and electrode potentials. Scheduled testing can be automated to reduce manual maintenance .

Maintenance

- Regularly inspect connections, electrodes, and communication modules.
- Clean and service the unit according to the maintenance schedule in the manual.
- Verify remote monitoring data integrity and ensure alarms or alerts are functioning correctly.

Troubleshooting

- Check wiring and power supply if the unit fails to operate.
- Confirm communication settings and network availability for remote monitoring.
- Refer to the troubleshooting section in the manual for error codes and corrective actions .
