1. Flameproof Enclosures (Ex d)

Flameproof distribution boxes are engineered to contain internal explosions and prevent flames from escaping into the surrounding atmosphere. They are suitable for environments with flammable gases or vapors and are commonly used in Zone 1 and Zone 2 hazardous areas. These enclosures are typically made from stainless steel or copper-free aluminum, offering high impact resistance, corrosion protection, and long-term durability. They comply with standards such as ATEX, IECEx, and UL and often feature IP66/67 protection ratings for dust and water ingress ().

2. Increased Safety Enclosures (Ex e)



Ex e distribution boxes focus on reducing ignition sources rather than containing explosions. They achieve this by using enhanced insulation, secure terminals, and robust construction to prevent sparks or overheating. These boxes are ideal for areas where maintenance access is frequent and where a fully flameproof enclosure may not be necessary. They are widely used in industrial plants with flammable gases or dust but lower risk of explosive events ().

3. Pressurized or Purged Enclosures (Ex p)

Pressurized (Ex p) distribution boxes maintain a positive internal pressure using clean air or inert gas to prevent explosive atmospheres from entering the enclosure. This type is suitable for environments with highly volatile gases or dust, where even minimal ingress could be hazardous. Purged systems are more complex but allow the use of standard electrical components inside the enclosure while maintaining safety ().

4. Gas-Tight Enclosures

Gas-tight distribution boxes provide complete sealing against gas and vapor ingress, ensuring that no flammable substances can enter the enclosure. These are particularly important in volatile chemical or oil processing environments. They are often combined with flameproof or pressurized designs to enhance safety ().

Key Considerations

- **Material Selection:** Stainless steel, aluminum, or certified polymers depending on corrosion and mechanical requirements.
- **Zone Classification:** Choose the type based on gas or dust zones (0/1/2 for gases, 20/21/22 for dust).
- **Standards Compliance:** ATEX, IECEx, UL, and local regulations must be followed.
- **Maintenance and Inspection:** Regular inspections (typically every 6–12 months) ensure continued protection and compliance ().
