Pole Sharing and Permissions

While some lightweight fiber cables may be lashed to existing cables, this is only allowed with explicit permission from the pole owner and after verifying that the pole can handle the additional load . Unauthorized attachments, including guying or auxiliary hooks, are prohibited because they can interfere with the fiber cable's tension, sag, and clearance requirements .

Safety and Clearance Requirements

Fiber optic installations require minimum clearances from the ground, power lines, and other utilities. For example, a minimum of 18 feet above traveled roads and 40 inches from energized conductors is standard . Adding other cables without proper planning can violate these clearances, creating safety hazards and regulatory non-compliance.

Best Practices

- Only attach cables to poles if structural capacity and permissions are confirmed.
- Use proper clamps and suspension hardware to maintain tension and prevent sag .
- Avoid attaching cables to existing communication anchors unless explicitly approved .
- Follow FOA and local utility standards for installation, spacing, and mechanical support .

In summary, hanging additional cables on fiber optic poles is not allowed unless all regulatory, mechanical, and safety requirements are met and proper authorization is obtained. Unauthorized attachments can compromise network performance, safety, and compliance.
