Before removing any cables, ensure all power is disconnected and verify with a voltage tester that no cables are live. Remove flammable materials and use appropriate safety gear, especially when working at heights, including fall arresters and insulating mats . Safety checks are critical to prevent accidents and protect personnel.

Planning and Preparation

- Loop Check Method: Verify cables without removing the entire length initially. Ideal for crowded trays or long runs, this method reduces the risk of accidentally cutting active cables .
 - Donut Method: Remove cables section by section as they are traced. This provides physical verification at each stage and is suitable for less crowded trays or when hazards require full removal before cutting .
 - Careful Disassembly: For straight tray sections, lift and remove as one piece. For turns or bends, disassemble section by section to avoid bending or damaging cables .
 - Cable Protection: Use anchor points every 2 meters for vertical cables and separate power from control cables to prevent interference or damage .
- Post-Removal Handling
- Sort and Collect Materials: Separate metal, insulating, and other materials for recycling or disposal .
 - Label Active Connections: Ensure any active cables that remain are clearly marked to prevent accidental disconnection . By combining pre-planning, proper tools, and verification methods, cable removal can be performed quickly, safely, and efficiently while minimizing the risk of damage to active systems and maintaining compliance with industry standards .
