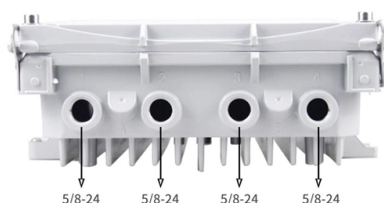

The International Telecommunication Union (ITU-T) Recommendation L.25 outlines general features for the maintenance and operation of optical fiber cable networks. It provides definitions, functions, and best practices for maintaining non-gas pressurized optical fiber networks, ensuring interoperability and reliability. This standard focuses on terrestrial networks and excludes submarine cables and transmission equipment management. Compliance is voluntary but recommended for consistent network performance and operational safety .
