When modifying communication cable trays, such as ladder, basket, or solid-bottom types, any drilled holes must not compromise the structural integrity of the tray or reduce its load-bearing capacity. The maximum recommended hole diameter for standard communications trays is approximately 0.196 inches (5 mm), as indicated in installation specifications for telecommunications rooms . Holes larger than this may weaken the tray or interfere with grounding continuity.

Spacing and Placement

- Avoid drilling near rungs or side rails to prevent stress concentration and potential deformation.
- Maintain uniform spacing between holes to preserve the tray's mechanical strength.



- Do not exceed the manufacturer's recommended number of holes per unit length, as excessive drilling can reduce the tray's ability to support cables safely .

Compliance and Safety

- Follow manufacturer instructions and coordinate with other trades before drilling .
- Ensure that grounding continuity is maintained; any holes should not interrupt the tray's bonding path .
- Adhere to applicable standards such as NFPA 70, NEMA VE 1, and BICSI guidelines for communications cabling and tray installation .
- For critical installations, consult a qualified professional engineer to verify that modifications do not compromise structural or electrical safety .

Practical Considerations

- Drilling should be limited to necessary points for cable entry, mounting brackets, or accessory attachment.
- Use proper tools and deburring techniques to prevent sharp edges that could damage cables.
- Document all modifications in shop drawings to ensure compliance with project specifications and future maintenance . By following these guidelines, drilling in communication cable trays can be performed safely while maintaining structural integrity, grounding, and compliance with industry standards.
