- **Power (POWER):** A solid light indicates the router or ONT is powered on. If off, check the power cable, outlet, or adapter .
 - **PON (Passive Optical Network):** Solid light means the fiber signal is normal. Blinking suggests abnormal signal levels, typically outside the preferred range of -20 dBm to -27 dBm .
 - **LOS (Loss of Signal):** Normally off. A red or blinking light indicates a fiber disconnection, dirty connector, broken patch cord, or no signal from the ISP .
 - **LAN:** Flickers when a device is connected and transmitting data. If off, the LAN port or cable may be faulty .
 - **WLAN / Wi-Fi:** Flickers with wireless activity. If off, Wi-Fi may be disabled in router settings .
- Interpreting Light Patterns
- **Solid green/blue:** Device is powered and functioning normally .

- Flashing green/blue: Data is being transmitted or the device is booting up .
- Red or amber: Indicates a hardware fault, power issue, or loss of internet connectivity .

Fiber Cable Considerations

- Inspect cables for visible damage, sharp bends, kinks, or crushing, which can degrade signal quality .
- Dirty connectors are a common cause of signal loss. Use a fiber inspection microscope and clean connectors with the wet/dry method or one-click cleaner .
- Maintain a minimum bend radius (typically 10 times the cable diameter) to prevent signal loss .
- Avoid touching the fiber endface with fingers and always inspect both ends before connecting .

Troubleshooting Steps

- Check power: Ensure the ONT and router are plugged in and receiving power .
- Inspect cables: Look for damage or loose connections .
- Restart devices: Power cycle the ONT and router to clear temporary faults .
- Check ISP status: If all lights appear normal but there's no internet, the issue may be with the provider . By monitoring the LED indicators and maintaining fiber cables properly, you can quickly identify and resolve most common fiber network issues, ensuring stable high-speed connectivity.
