Always use a power meter to detect active fibers and never look directly into a fiber end . **Fiber Shards:** Cutting, splicing, or terminating fibers produces tiny glass fragments that can puncture skin, embed in clothing, or become airborne. These shards are difficult to see and can cause injury if not handled properly. Proper disposal in sealed containers is essential . **Chemical Risks:** Adhesives, cleaning agents, and other chemicals used in fiber optic installation can be hazardous. Use gloves, eye protection, and follow manufacturer safety instructions when handling these substances . **Mechanical and Construction Hazards:** Installing optical cables often involves working at heights, in confined spaces, or near electrical infrastructure. Risks include falls, cuts, and equipment-related injuries. Standard construction PPE—hard hats, steel-toed boots, high-visibility vests, and gloves—should always be worn .

- Follow Regulatory Standards: Comply with OSHA, NESC, and local safety regulations, as well as company-specific safety protocols .
- Use Proper PPE: Eye protection, gloves, hard hats, steel-toed boots, and high-visibility clothing are mandatory. Supervisors must ensure compliance at all times .
- Cable Handling: Respect minimum bending radius, pulling tension, and torsion limits to prevent internal fiber damage. Use swivel grips and compatible lubricants for long pulls .
- Traffic and Worksite Safety: Implement traffic management plans, barriers, warning signs, and ensure first aid and emergency equipment are available .
- Training and Supervision: All personnel should be trained in safe work methods, emergency procedures, and proper handling of fiber optic materials .

Emergency Preparedness

- Maintain accessible first aid kits and trained personnel on site.
- Record and report all incidents, injuries, or property damage.
- Equip vehicles with fire extinguishers and emergency equipment .
