

The network rack patch cord is too long



Overview

This guide gives you a repeatable method to plan patch cord lengths so racks stay maintainable. It's written for integrators, engineers, and anyone on the buying side who wants the rack to remain readable after handover. A patch cord that's a little too long doesn't just look messy—it hides port IDs, creates door pinch, and encourages tight bends right at the panel and switch. Multiply that across dozens of ports and you end up with the classic spaghetti rack: hard to read, hard to change, and surprisingly easy to. A patch cable (or patch cord) is a short-length networking cable used to connect devices like switches, routers, and patch panels in structured cabling systems. Unlike permanent cabling, patch cables are designed for flexibility, quick installation, and frequent rearrangements. Typically, patch. If you are using more than 1 rack - USE PATCH PANELS - a punch down tool and patch panels allow for you to very simply run cable at any length you desire - very clean and neat. One reason I love this approach. I am going to redo a network rack. It has two 48 port patch panels that are 2u each. The arrangement I'm looking at doing is: PP1 SW1 SW2 PP2 Patch Panel 1 will patch to Switch 1. Consider the first panel. The contractor terminated them with keystones but unfortunately made them too short (they are 20 to 60 cm long from the wall). My plan was to install a 12U or 15U wall mount rack on the grey part of the wall (which is reinforced drywall) but the cables are too short to reach a patch panel inside a. There's a 2U 48 port patch panel between each switch.
