- **Safety Risks:** Lack of intermediate protection increases the chance of electrical faults affecting multiple areas simultaneously .
- **Operational Inefficiency:** Direct connections from the primary box can complicate load management and maintenance .
- **Non-compliance:** Construction and electrical codes often require a three-tiered distribution system (primary, secondary, tertiary) to ensure proper protection and control .

Recommended Actions

- **Install Secondary Distribution Boxes:** Place them strategically to serve each building or floor, ensuring proper load distribution and safety.
- **Ensure Proper Equipment:** Include large three-phase breakers, isolating switches, and residual current devices (RCDs) as required .
- **Follow Safety Standards:** Use rainproof, powder-coated enclosures with inner and outer doors for outdoor installations .
- **Plan for Maintenance:** Secondary boxes simplify inspection and troubleshooting, reducing downtime and risk of damage.
