- 24-way to 42-way panels: Typical for larger homes or those with multiple high-demand appliances, providing room for future expansion . It is recommended to add 30% spare capacity when planning circuits to accommodate future appliances or upgrades .

- Safety devices: Modern distribution boxes include main switches, RCBOs, and surge protection devices to prevent overloads and protect against faults .
- Future-proofing: Choosing a panel with extra slots allows for additions like EV chargers, solar panels, or home automation systems .
- Code compliance: Always ensure the panel meets local electrical codes and is installed by a licensed electrician .
