When cable trays are not present, rigid or flexible conduits (PVC, steel, or aluminum) can be used to protect power and control cables. Conduits provide mechanical protection, prevent accidental damage, and maintain proper separation between high-voltage and low-voltage lines, reducing electromagnetic interference. For outdoor or corrosive environments, galvanized steel or PVC-coated conduits are recommended to resist moisture and UV exposure.

Securing and Routing Cables



Cables should be fastened securely along walls, ceilings, or underground trenches using clamps, brackets, or cable ties. Maintain adequate spacing between cables to prevent heat accumulation and allow for inspection and maintenance . Avoid sharp bends and ensure the shortest, straightest path possible to reduce voltage drop and simplify future maintenance .

Fire Safety and Compliance

Even without cable trays, it is essential to adhere to fire safety standards. Use fire-resistant conduits or sleeves when passing through fire-rated walls or floors, and provide firestops at penetrations to prevent the spread of fire or smoke . Ensure all wiring methods comply with NEC Article 300 and 392 or local electrical codes, including proper grounding and bonding .

Underground or Buried Wiring

For outdoor installations, cables can be buried in trenches with protective conduits or duct banks. Ensure proper depth, warning tapes, and separation from other utilities. Use moisture-resistant and UV-protected cables for long-term durability .

Inspection and Maintenance

Regularly inspect the wiring for mechanical damage, insulation wear, and grounding continuity. Remove any abandoned or unused cables to prevent hazards. Ensure that all connections are secure and that cables are not overloaded .
